



Gian Clavell tabbed SportingNews Preseason Junior College All-American

After a stellar freshman season at Northwest Tech, guard Gian Clavell is starting to garner national attention. Clavell was selected as a third team preseason junior college All-American by the SportingNews for the upcoming 2013-14 season. The honor is the first of its kind for Clavell and the Mavericks basketball program, now in its second year.

Clavell burst onto the junior college basketball scene as a freshman scoring 19.4 points per game and grabbing 6.7 rebounds per contest. Clavell was one of only two players in the country to average at least 19 points per game, 6.5 rebounds per game and 4 assists per game last season (Mohammed Lee, San Jacinto College-Central). Add in Clavell's 39% 3-point field goal percentage and he stands alone as the only player in the NJCAA to put up those kind of numbers.

The sophomore from Caguas, Puerto Rico will be looked upon heavily to lead the Northwest Tech program to bigger heights this season after a 16-15 campaign in the inaugural season of Maverick hoops. Clavell's recruitment will also be fun to watch, as he currently holds offers from many NCAA Division I schools. Included in the pursuit of Clavell are schools from the SEC, Mountain West, Big Sky and more. The Maverick's season tips off on November 1 at the Seward County Pepsi Classic in Liberal, KS.
